Reginald Adams. Adams is a public artist, “artpreneur” and community developer. He is best known for his award-winning tile mosaic murals and art installations, which are strategically located in some of Houston’s most historic and underserved neighborhoods. His creativity and artistic approach is inspired by his travels to more than 28 countries around the globe. Adams fundamentally believes that everyone deserves access and exposure to the arts. He strives to engage the public in the design and production of his public art projects. Over the past 20 years Reginald has facilitated the design, coordination and production over 200 public art projects across the Houston area and around the globe. These projects have been co-created with the involvement of over 40,000 area youth, artists and hundreds of community stakeholders.



Jesse Lott. Lott is a prominent local artist and a recent recipient of Art League Houston’s Lifetime Achievement Award in the Visual Arts (2016). He is best known for his wire and papier-mache sculptures of human and animal figures and for his approach to what he calls “Urban Frontier Art” or using discarded urban materials in his artwork. He is a strong presence in the Houston arts community and is one of the founders of Project Row Houses in the Third Ward.



Tony Parana. Parana is a local artist, originally from Brazil and a current resident of the Fifth Ward. Parana works primarily in oil painting and mosaics. He is very active in the local arts scene, founding the Montrose Arts Society in 2010 and establishing platforms for bringing creative arts into underserved communities. He is also a musician and teaches the martial art of Capoeira.
