May 18 is HIV Vaccine Awareness Day

Legacy Community Health infectious disease health professionals are available for comment on need for HIV and AIDS vaccine.

HOUSTON – (May 15, 2023) – Per the <u>National Institutes of Health (NIH)</u>, HIV Vaccine Awareness Day is observed every year on May 18 and commemorates U.S. President Bill Clinton's 1997 declaration that, "only a truly effective, preventive HIV vaccine can limit and eventually eliminate the threat of AIDS." It recognizes the many volunteers, community members, health professionals, and scientists working together to develop a vaccine to prevent HIV and AIDS.

"This day is a great opportunity to highlight the need for an HIV vaccine and the work that has been done in HIV/AIDS research," says Jill Jahns, MPH, Public Health Director at Legacy Community Health. "HIV prevention and treatment are vital to ending the pandemic. Getting out and in touch with our communities to make sure they're aware of their options is just one way Legacy is driving change."

There are still ways to prevent the spread of HIV, even without an approved vaccine. One of the highly effective methods is PrEP (pre-exposure prophylaxis), which can be taken both orally or as an injectable to prevent the passing of HIV.

If you have been exposed to HIV, PEP (post-exposure prophylaxis) can prevent HIV if taken up to 72 hours after exposure.

For those living with HIV, taking antiretroviral therapy (ART) is an effective treatment proven to lower one's viral load to undetectable and untransmittable levels.

PrEP, PEP, and ART may be available through a Legacy provider and at Wellness Bar by Legacy.
